Program Overview

ORGANIZATION PURPOSE

Diamond In The Rough (DITR) is an award winning, faith-based, non-denominational, youth development and leadership program that serves girls ages 4-18. Our organizational purpose is to prepare, inspire, nurture and provide knowledge to girls through a variety of preventative programs and enrichment activities that build self-esteem, character, and leadership. Diamond In The Rough is committed to transforming the world one child, one family, one community at a time.

ORGANIZATION PHILOSOPHY

Diamond In The Rough (DITR) was formed on the belief that our children are like diamonds; each one is precious, unique and full of potential. Our youth, like diamonds, require time, patience, and polishing to uncover and expose their true quality, value and brilliance. DITR is committed to providing young girls regardless of race, social or economic status, the information, resources, and opportunity to shine.

ORGANIZATION MISSION

As a faith-based, non-profit youth program, our mission is to transform the world one child at a time. DITR seeks to empower girls spiritually, physically, emotionally, intellectually, and financially. At DITR, our goal is to assist parents in nurturing and raising young girls into dynamic women.

DITR provides a wide variety of activities including weekly mentoring, leadership training, college and career coaching, family enrichment activities, and special events offered to girls in a safe, structured, fun environment. DITR seeks to empower girls physically, emotionally, intellectually, spiritually and financially. Our program is designed to help girls walk in their purpose and take hold of the promises and the possibilities of God.

ORGANIZATION MOTTO:

The Diamond In The Rough (DITR) motto is "Think PINK". Every program and activity is designed to provide

- Preparation – Preparing girls for tomorrow while celebrating who they are today.
- Inspiration – Inspiring girls to embrace their uniqueness while living a life of passion and purpose.
- Nurturing – Nurturing girls to grow while providing a fun, safe environment where they are respected and accepted unconditionally.
- Knowledge – Knowledge is power and DITR provides girls with the tools and resources to be successful.

ORGANIZATION GOALS

Diamond In The Rough (DITR) desires to serve as a full resource for young girls including, but not limited to, wayward and at-risk girls in elementary, post-secondary and high school. DITR's goals include the following:

- ◆ To provide a safe, structured, and conducive environment for girls to express themselves and learn and grow.
- ◆ To work in conjunction with the schools, parents and the community in creating future leaders.
- ◆ To offer long-term mentoring and training programs that will create life long relationships and long term results.
- ◆ To assist girls in becoming responsible, productive, successful adults through a complete holistic program.
- ◆ Help guide girls in making informed and intelligent decisions about their future.
- ◆ Teach girls to love themselves as God loves them.
- ◆ Equip and teach girls to tap into their gifts and talents and to live a purposeful life.
- ◆ To partner with other youth organizations to aid and meet the full needs of our participants.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Diamond In The Rough (DITR) offers the following programs to girls to meet a variety of needs and interests:

CLUSTERS MENTORING PROGRAM™ – is a long term mentoring and leadership development program. This program is offered to girls between the ages of 10-18 and has three distinct levels based on age and grade. Each small Clusters™ group meets one day weekly or bi-weekly for 1-2 hours at a centralized location during the school year. This program is designed to build life-long relationships and long-term results. The purpose of the Clusters™ Program is to:

- Build character and confidence under the guidance of caring adult mentors.
- Offer weekly activities that build leadership while lending a listening ear.
- Encourages girls to embrace their unique qualities and identify their God given talents.
- Build self-esteem while creating a sense of sisterhood.
- Create an environment where girls can talk freely and be themselves.
- Offer activities that are exciting, entertaining and educational.
- Teach girls to respect themselves and others.
- Promote community service and stewardship.

CORE YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

The CORE Youth Leadership Program is for Diamond In The Rough participants who express an interest and desire in serving in a leadership capacity within the organization. CORE participants are provided additional leadership training and assist DITR adult advisors with program development and planned activities. Participants are given the opportunity to serve in leadership roles including serving as members of the Youth Advisory Board or Peer Facilitating Team.

DIAMONDS IN DEVELOPMENT™

The Diamonds In Development Program is geared toward girls ages 4 - 9 years old and offers quarterly educational and entertaining activities. The purpose of the program is to build self esteem, character, faith and friendships and to build a strong foundation.

OPTIONS CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM™

The OPTIONS Career Development Program is offered to high school students and incorporates *Junior Achievements Success Skills and Job Shadowing Program*. The purpose of OPTIONS is to empower participants with skills and information that will enable them to be successful with their post-high school education and careers. The program includes monthly workshops, guest speakers, career & educational fieldtrips, career exploration opportunities and college preparation.

OPULENT OPALS PROGRAM™

Opulent Opals is a short-term life skills development program for girls in transitional situations or in environments that would not normally allow them to benefit from a long-term program. This program is offered through Boys & Girls Clubs and other programs which serve youth within the community. It is through the Opulent Opals Program™ that DITR seeks to offer guidance, encouragement, resources and support.

DITR PERFORMING ARTS COMPANY (DITR-PAC)™

The Diamond In The Rough Performing Arts Company offers girls an opportunity to explore the art of Musical Theatre and learn a combination of styles and techniques for ACTING, SINGING and DANCE. This innovative program incorporates moral/value-based themes and inspirational musical styles to promote an environment of encouragement and excellence! Students will be encouraged to creatively express themselves in a positive way while, discovering their potential, developing confidence skills and building inner value for stage and for life.

VILLAGE FAMILY ENRICHMENT PROGRAM™

The Village Family Enrichment Program was created to empower parents and to help bridge the gap between parents and youth through regular scheduled interactive activities, workshops & forums that encourage dialogue among families and help to form stronger bonds which build communication and trust. The program also provides parents with resources for specific areas of interest.

WORKSHOPS, CAMPS & CONFERENCES – Diamond In The Rough (DITR) offers a variety of workshops, camps and conferences throughout the year that have specific areas of focus including the following:

- **Character Counts™** - a module designed to build character and leadership.
- **GEM Camp™** - an annual camp hosted at the beginning of each school year designed to motivate and empower girls while building self-esteem and sisterhood among new and seasoned DITR members.
- **Girls of Greatness Abstinence Conference™** - a fun and interactive series of workshops, activities, and special guests with a focus on creating awareness and educating youth on the physical, emotional and spiritual consequences of pre-marital sex.
- **Girls Rock™** - an interactive camp designed for middle school girls to build leadership and self-esteem. Topics include appearance, communication, media influence, peer pressure and self-image.
- **Got Respect™** - Got Respect, is an interactive enrichment camp for girl's ages 8-14 years old. This leadership and self-esteem camp is designed to empower girls and teach them the incredible power of self-love, self-assurance, self-respect, and self-control.
- **Love, Lust & Lies - Love, Lust and Lies** is an abstinence program designed for co-ed participants ages 12-15 years old. It is designed to address the physical, emotional, social, financial and spiritual consequences of pre-marital sex. The module is designed to deal with the importance of self-love and respect, lust and avoiding temptation, and addressing the lies of the world as it relates to teen sex.
- **Mirror Mirror** - an interactive self-image and leadership module designed for high school girls. Topics include appearance, communication, media influence, peer pressure and self-image.
- **Operation Preparation** - a college and educational preparation workshop offering tips for college planning & preparation, high school checklist, tips on scholarships and funding, non-traditional educational options and special guests to discuss their personal experience.
- **Treasures Beyond Measure™** - designed to provide young women with the tools and resources to make healthy decisions about their bodies, relationships, and their futures. Designed to educate, empower and raise awareness. The 10-workshop module program is creative, interactive and engages youth while incorporating group discussions, creative exercises, introspective activities and role play.

CLUB MEMBERSHIP LEVELS & COST

In an effort to meet the ever growing needs of the youth and families we serve, DITR now offers two levels of membership based on the needs and interests of the participant. Registration is open twice a year in July and January, based on space availability.

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP – provides members the opportunity to participate in select DITR activities including GEM Camp, The Village Family Enrichment Program and receive special discounts, incentives and given first priority to DITR sponsored programs and special events. **The annual non-refundable general membership fee is \$30.00 if paid by August 1st and \$40.00 if paid after August 1st.**

CLUSTER MEMBERSHIP – offers the full benefits of DITR general membership in addition to our weekly mentoring program, field trips and specific programs and activities. Cluster Membership is optional to all DITR members and is available on a first-come-first-serve basis. See participation levels (previous page) to view the full benefits of Clusters Membership.

Cluster Membership requires the annual general membership fee and membership dues of \$15/month. Cluster dues must be pre-paid by September 12th or set up as monthly or quarterly automatic draft. If not paid by the due date, a \$5.00 late charge will be added and there is a \$30 fee for all returned checks or NSF fees. If dues are not paid, Cluster Membership benefits will cease and the child will be removed from the Cluster Membership roster and her space will be made available to another child.

REGISTRATION

Registration for our youth program begins in July and continues until all spaces are filled. Open enrollment is offered for renewal to existing members and any vacant slots are then offered on a first-come-first-serve basis until we reach maximum capacity.

PARENT REQUIREMENT

Diamond In The Rough seeks to maintain a close relationship with the parent(s) or guardian(s) of our members. Parents or guardians are required to attend a parent orientation which will be held the morning of **GEM Camp**. Parent/Guardian participation is required and involvement may include:

- ◆ Becoming a monthly partner with DITR
- ◆ Assisting in corporate and fundraising efforts
- ◆ Volunteering a minimum of once a quarter
- ◆ Serving as a member of the Parent Advisory Board
- ◆ Serving as a chaperone for DITR fieldtrips

CLUSTERS' ATTENDANCE POLICY

Members are required to attend all regularly scheduled meetings and activities. Parents/Guardians are required to contact the DITR office prior to a meeting or scheduled activity in the event their child will not be present. If there are in excess of three (3) unexcused absences by a child, she may be removed from the DITR program.

CLUSTERS FIELD TRIP POLICY

DITR activities may involve field trips or other off-site activities. Parents or guardians will be given prior notice of those events and will be required to provide a signed authorization for each child. A nominal cost will be assessed for field trips and payment must be received a minimum of five days before the activity. Parents/Guardians are also encouraged to join these activities.

GEM CAMP

Participation in our annual GEM Camp kick-off is mandatory prior to participating in a DITR Cluster group and is open to DITR general members. GEM Camp is a one-day event which will be held on **Saturday, September 12th** and the cost is included in the annual non-refundable, general membership fee of \$30 if paid by August 1st or \$40 if paid after that date.

PARENT PICK-UP

Parents or guardians are responsible for seeing that a child is picked up no later than the pre-designated pick-up time. Because DITR activities are held at off-site locations, all DITR staff members and volunteers must leave the premises no later than fifteen (15) minutes after the designated pick-up time.

To ensure the safety and well-being of our youth, a parent or guardian **MUST** come into the building to pick-up their child. Parents are to contact DITR staff immediately if circumstances prevent the timely pickup of a child. Under those circumstances, the parent or guardian will be assessed a late pick-up fee as described below.

LATE FEES

If a parent or guardian fails to pick-up a child by the designated pickup time, the following will occur:

- ◆ A monetary charge of \$1.00 per minute will be required for every minute thereafter
- ◆ Payment must be made at the time of pick-up
- ◆ There will be no exceptions to the late fee assessment

COMMUNICATION

Members and parents/guardians are encouraged to talk with a DITR staff person whenever they have questions or concerns.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Everyone affiliated with DITR is expected to follow the Code of Conduct as indicated below. DITR members must:

- ◆ Have a desire and expressed interest to be a member
- ◆ Have written parental/guardian approval to be a member
- ◆ Be on time
- ◆ Be kind, fair and honest
- ◆ Be respectful of others and their property
- ◆ Not judge others
- ◆ Do their best
- ◆ Tell the truth
- ◆ Seek to resolve conflict in a positive way
- ◆ Not use improper language
- ◆ Acknowledge the efforts of others
- ◆ Not have alcohol, drugs or weapons while involved in DITR activities
- ◆ Carry themselves in a respectful manner

Failure to comply with the Code of Conduct may result in suspension or termination of member involvement in DITR activities.

DISCIPLINE

Diamond In The Rough seeks to create a safe environment for all participants and will attempt to resolve potential conflicts in the following ways:

- ◆ Hold a private meeting with a DITR staff member, volunteers and participant(s)
- ◆ Involve the parent or guardian
- ◆ Evaluate the need for suspension or termination of membership
- ◆ Document and inform all parties of the recommended resolution
